Fair Play Code for Team Officials

The Kingston United Soccer Club is committed to keeping soccer as our "beautiful game", and we strive to keep the game fun for all. We expect all our team officials (coaches and managers) to abide by the following Fair Play Code.

- 1. I will be reasonable when scheduling games and practices. Remember the other interests of the players.
- 2. I will teach my players to play fair and respect the rules of the game.
- 3. I will avoid over-playing talented players. Every player must get fair playing time. I will remember that "I pick them, I play them".
- 4. I will never ridicule or yell at players for making mistakes or losing. I will remember that children play for fun and satisfaction.
- 5. I will ensure that equipment and facilities meet safety standards and are appropriate for the player's age and ability.
- 6. I will teach my team to respect the opposing team and the judgement of officials. I will help them learn that infractions can result in discipline, and that they ruin the beautiful game of soccer.
- 7. I will follow a physician's advice to decide when injured players are ready to play again.
- 8. I will remember that children need a coach that they can respect. I will be generous with deserved praise and set a good example.
- 9. I will keep informed on sound coaching techniques based on the principles of growth and development of children.
- 10. I will never be alone and out of sight with a player other than my own child, and thus will also never transport a child other than my own child alone to a Club activity.
- 11. I will respect and adhere to the Rules and Regulations of the Ontario Soccer Association, the Kingston United Soccer Club, and any League or Tournament (House League or other) in which my team is participating.

I also acknowledge that if I fail to abide by the aforementioned Code, I may be subject to disciplinary action, to be determined by the Club as appropriate.

CPIC AND KUSC

Kingston United Soccer Club wants all volunteers working with youth to complete a basic Police Screening Check (CPIC). Your screening feedback should be presented with your application. Your report is deemed *confidential*. When working with the vulnerable sector it is important that we take steps to ensure both the safety of youth and our volunteers. Be sure to follow the steps below to have your CPIC completed. Bring your receipt with you completed CPIC to the KUSC office for reimbursement.

The OPP and Kingston Police Force have different processes for obtaining Criminal Records Checks. Coaches will first need to determine which agency they need to use to make their request. This is determined by where you reside. If you reside within Kingston City limits, then you make your request through the Kingston City Policy Force.

If you reside outside the City of Kingston, determine which OPP detachment polices the area where you live. There is a search engine in the link provided if you are not sure.

Kingston City Police Force takes online requests.

The <u>OPP website</u> will provide further information in terms of what types of checks are required and the type of identification that is accepted when making your request.

- You cannot request a CPIC online with the OPP
- You must attend in person and provide identification at the time of your request
- Forms will be made available at the detachment
